OVERVIEW OF MEDI-THEFT PROJECT

The EU co-funded project MEDI-THEFT Data sharing and Investigative Platform against Organised Thefts of Medicines - has been launched November 1st, 2021. MEDI-THEFT aims to counteract medicine theft and reselling through the development of an intelligence-based platform to report, analyse and share data.

The project is funded under the ISF Programme and led by AIFA with the participation of SAFE Foundation, Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore -Transcrime, Istituto Poligrafico e Zecca dello Stato (IPZS), Affordable Medicines Europe (AME), Medicines and Medical Devices Agency of Serbia (ALIMS), Institute for Medicines and Medical Devices of Montenegro (CInMED) and Arma dei Carabinieri.

MEDI-THEFT main objectives are:

- 1.Collect, share and analyze information related to medicine theft to identify and prevent criminals' modi operandi.
- 2. Produce and share early warnings to prevent stolen medicines and medical devices to re-enter the legal market.
- 3. Support and improve joint transnational investigations related to medicine theft.



MEDI-THEFT: inception and vision

We invited MEDI-THEFT Project Coordinator, Dr. Domenico Di Giorgio, to give us an insight on the project origins, and its next steps.

Q: Thank you for joining us, Dr. Di Giorgio. Can you talk about the basis of the Project?

A: MEDI-THEFT is the natural follow up to our previous initiatives in this field, in particular with respect to the Operation Volcano (2014) and to the EC project FakeShare and FakeSare II, both led by AIFA and focused on the set up of web based infrastructures aimed at structuring the available knowledge on specific categories of pharmaceutical crime.

In all of those initiatives, we always worked with this view - fostering data sharing and cooperation between health authorities, police forces, customs, laboratories and private stakeholders: then, MEDI-THEFT will be another opportunity for defining new tools and procedures for a cooperative effort against pharmacrime.

Q: What's the added value that this project will bring to the EU and its Member States?

A: In the last 2 years, as a consequence of the pandemic emergency, the European authorities set up many different workstreams and fora fostering the dialogue between MS, supporting the involvement of the private stakeholders,

when the objective of an activity may be considered as a common goal, to be pursued in cooperation with no conflict of interests. Pharmaceutical crime counteraction is an area where this approach has already been applied for more than 10 years: then, extending this network and refining the cooperation tools will not simply strengthen the activities in this field, but will also provide all MS models that may be applied in other areas, such as shortages prevention.

Q: Can you tell us what are your expectation for the future of the project, and what the work the Consortium is doing will bring us?

A: As for the Fakeshare projects, our goal is to build something that may go beyond the timeframe of the EC grant: this is the reason why we involved many relevant institutional partners in the initiative. For example, the National Mint, that will set up the IT platform; the center Transcrime - Università Cattolica, managing the criminal profiling processes; the Italian Carabinieri, as first end-users that will test and use the platform. Moreover, we will engage European and international actors to share relevant information and experiences to magnify the impact of the project results outside the EU.

We want to be sure that the "good practices" and tools that we will develop together may become a reference for all MS, and then will receive support from all authorities even after 2025..


